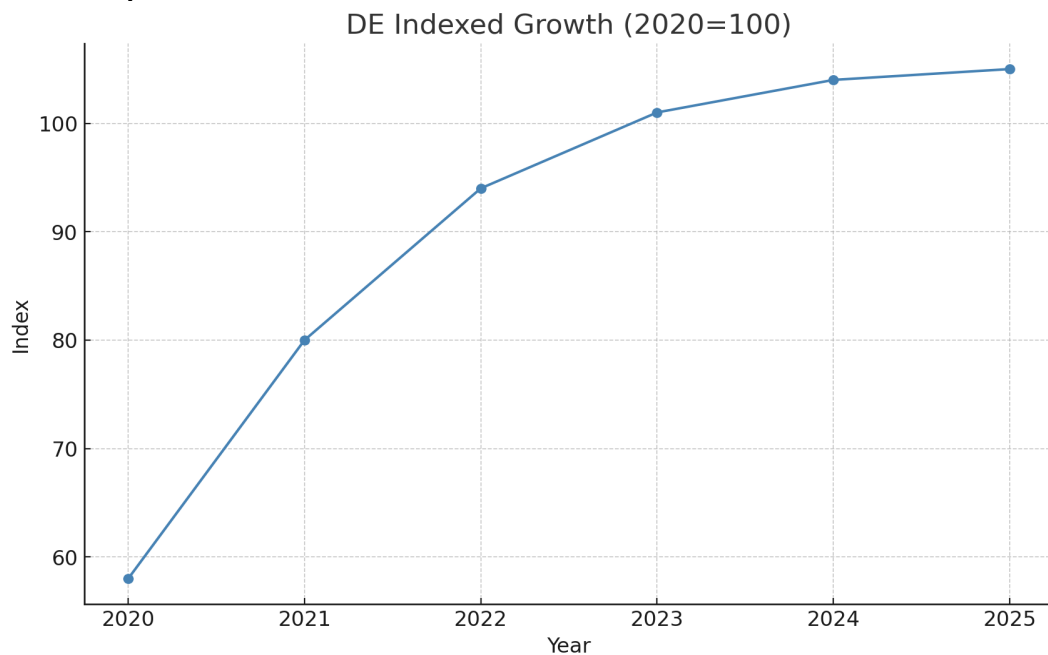

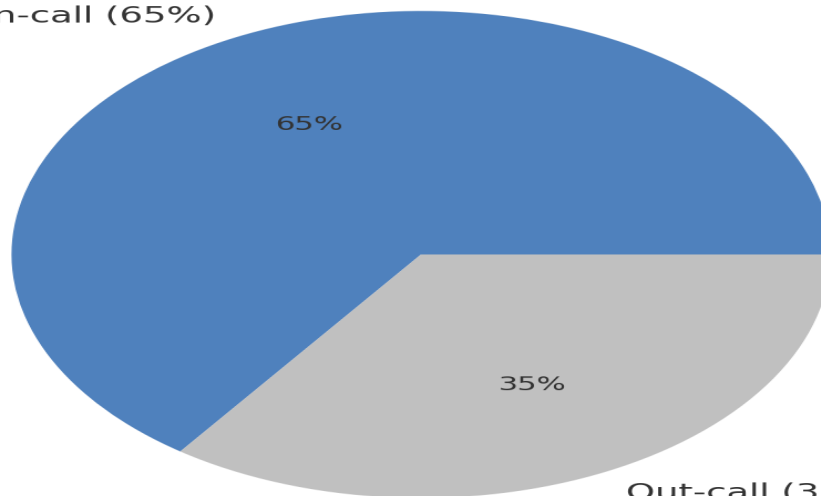
# Germany (DE)

Out-call (35%)

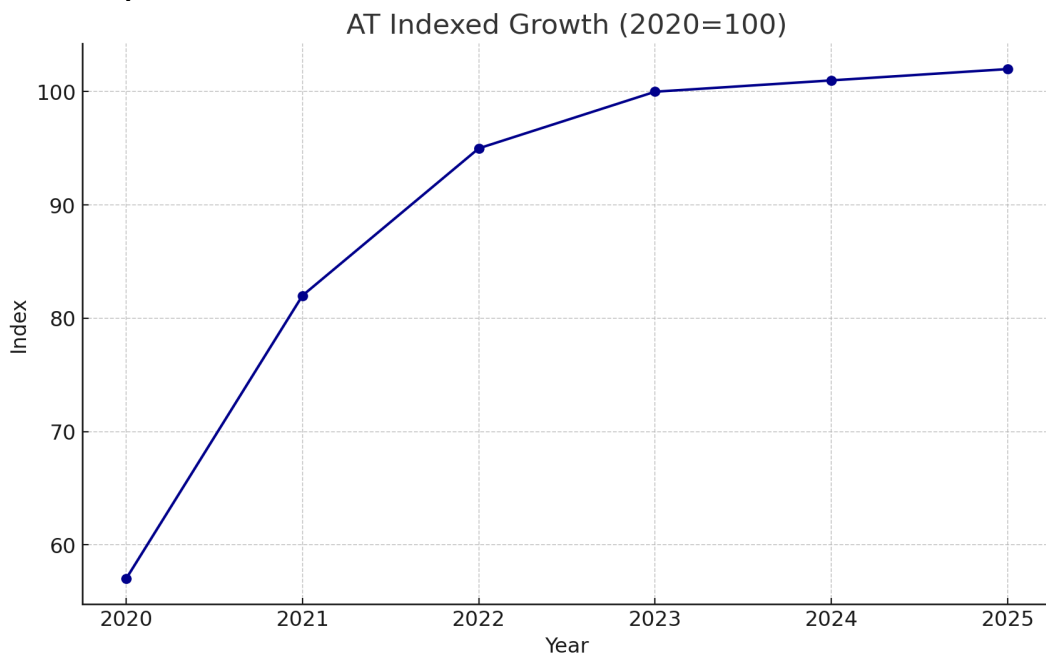

Germany's market is one of Europe's largest, shaped by the Prostituiertenschutzgesetz (2017) which requires registration and licensing. Berlin and Hamburg are leading hubs, while Munich attracts business-related demand. Bookings are dominated by in-call sessions in studios and clubs,

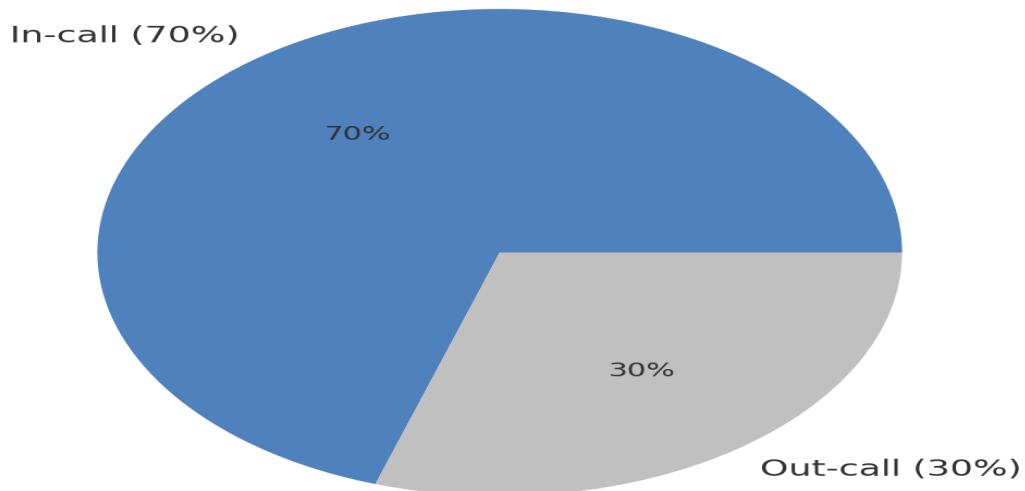
complemented by hotel out-calls. The market has recovered fully post-COVID and shows stable demand.

## AT In-call vs Out-call



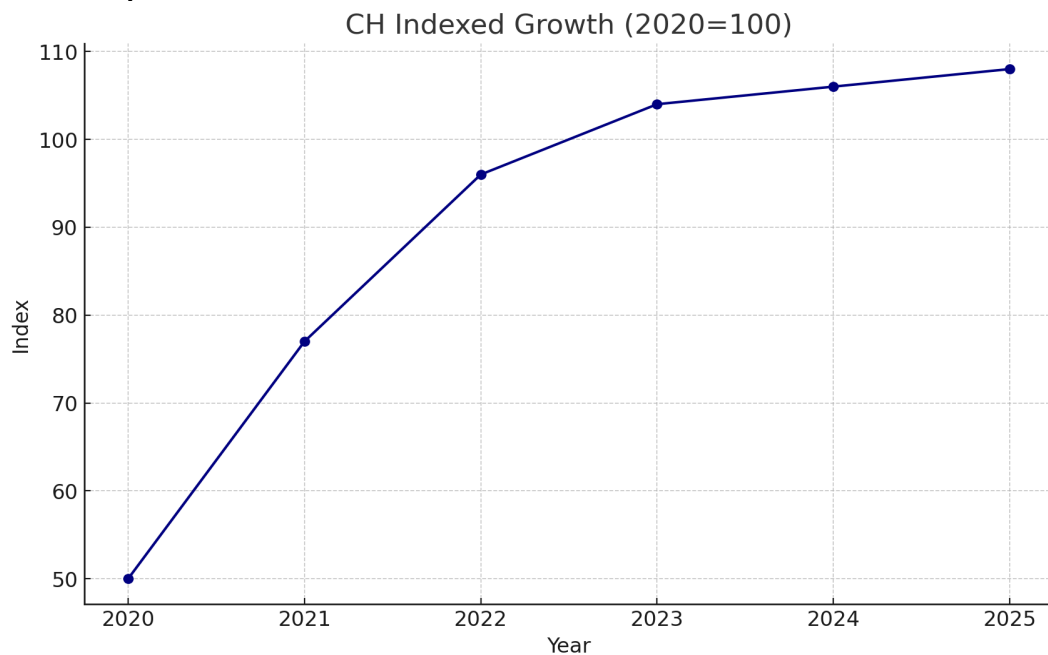

Austria's sex work market is legal and regulated at the state (Länder) level. Vienna, Graz, and Linz are main centers. The majority of bookings are in-call in licensed venues, though hotel-based out-call demand is rising. Post-COVID recovery has stabilized into a mature, regulated market with

low but steady growth.

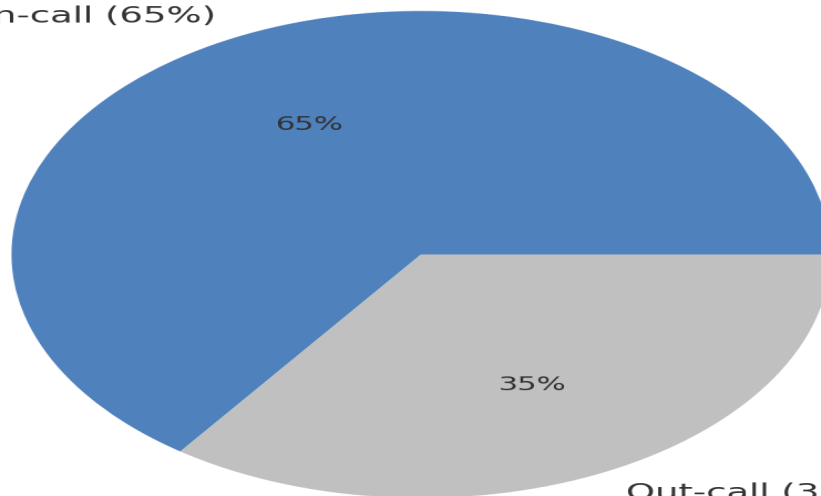
# Switzerland (CH)

Switzerland has a long tradition of legalized and regulated sex work (since 1942). Zurich, Geneva, and Basel are the main hubs. The market is dominated by in-call bookings at salons and studios, complemented by hotel out-calls. Recovery post-COVID has been strong, and demand remains

steady. Regulation is strict at cantonal and municipal levels.
